From the Pastor

Catholics treasure the sign of the cross. Its origin is not clear but likely goes back to the time of the apostles. We want to trace it carefully because it is full of symbolic meaning. We begin in the NAME. There is just one God and we speak his name. We do the sign in the name of the Father who is creator and Lord of all. WE honor the Son who became man for our sake and offered his life on the cross. The cross is a sign of triumph because Christ rose from the dead. We think also of the Holy Spirit who is the bond of love between Father and Son.

We trace the cross because Jesus told us that we need to take up the cross in order to follow Him. This means a daily offering of our lives with Jesus. Our humble gifts of bread and wine are made holy by the joining of our wills with the will of God.

We conclude our prayer with AMEN. This Hebrew word expresses agreement like a strongly-spoke YES! Use the sign of the cross before and after prayers as a visible expression of faith. Make sure that your children (grandchildren) know as use this sign correctly and devoutly.

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

September 22, 2018

I would like to thank the 40-60 people who attended the annual meeting this past Sunday. As school principal it's a honor and privilege to be able to attend these meetings and to share the good things that are happening at St. Mary School both today, and as we continue to look forward. The minutes from the annual meeting are currently posted on our website under the "Parish" tab, and then "Annual Meeting" on the right hand side.

During the first few weeks of school we did a number of assessments in reading and math to gauge where our students are today, so we can better meet their individual needs moving forward. Starting this past week I'm in our 1st - 6th grade classrooms daily to work with students on math. This help is in addition to the math teaching they already receive from their classroom teacher. The goal is to give students extra attention in math so they can quickly catch up to their peers. We have plans to start a similar program with reading later this month or early October.

As a school we're always looking for volunteers to help in a variety of ways: from helping make copies, volunteering in the lunch room or on the playground, to helping in the classroom. One of the ways you can help in the classroom is by simply listening to a child read their story out loud to them. Kids love the one on one attention they get from reading to an adult, and it also really helps them academically as it helps them practice their fluency as they read. Another way would be to review math flashcards with the students to help them with their basic facts.

If you're interested in helping out at St. Mary School, please contact the school office at 920.845.2224. All volunteers must have completed the online diocesan background check as well as having completed a VIRTUS course. If you're unsure if you have completed these requirements, or just need a little help, just let us know!
